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IMPORTANT INFORMATION

CONTACTING YOUR SON/DAUGHTER:

Each student is issued with an Aiglon e-mail account, which they have the possibility of checking most days. We advise students to contact their parents soon after arrival, informing them of the telephone numbers of their houseparents and the student telephones in the particular building or chalet in which they are staying. The Vacation Courses office is open during the daytime, and when closed, the line is diverted to the Director's mobile telephone. Please note, however, that the very nature of the course means that students are often away from campus on activities, excursions and expedition. Please also read the section on homesickness in the Conditions of Acceptance document. You may actually be assisting your child by not contacting them during the first four to five days of the Summer School.

POCKET MONEY:

It is recommended that you give your child about SFr 500 pocket money for the 3 weeks. Students will be asked to hand in pocket money to Houseparents at the beginning to the course for safe-keeping, and students are able to take out pocket-money in respectable amounts on a daily basis throughout the course.

MOBILE TELEPHONES:

Students may bring their mobile telephones, but we strongly discourage it. If students do bring their mobiles, they must give these to houseparents for safe keeping. Students may *only* use their mobile telephones in free time (generally this is from 17.00-18.30, and on some days only).

VALUABLE ITEMS:

Children are asked **not** to bring other valuable items such as expensive jewellery, laptops, stereos, mobile phones which might be lost or broken. If they are planning on bringing a camera, it is best to choose a small inexpensive one. We cannot accept responsibility in case of damage, loss or misuse of ANY item.

PUBLICITY MATERIALS:

Aiglon Summer School reserves the right to use photographs and videos taken of students during the course. These may be used in the course magazine and video and for other publicity material. Parents who do not wish to have their children appear are asked to inform us in writing.
